## **DECISION NOTICE**

## DURO ROAD REALIGNMENT PROJECT (DRAP), SAN PASQUAL INDIAN RESERVATION, SAN DIEGO COUNTY, CALIFORNIA

Notice is hereby given that the Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA) has decided to approve the San Pasqual DRAP for the grading and the installation of culverts and drains to accommodate a 650-foot long new road alignment of the southern portion of Duro Road within a 1.6-acre area. The new proposed intersection with Lake Wohlford Road will be located approximately 400 feet east of the current intersection. The northernmost portion of the new road alignment will tie back to the existing Duro Road. The DRAP Environmental Assessment (EA) concluded that no significant impacts to the environment will result from this project.

## **DECISION**

I have decided to proceed in implementing specific actions associated with the Preferred Alternative in the EA, as described above. This decision may be appealed to the Interior Board of Indian Appeals, 801 N. Quincy Street, Suite 300, Arlington, VA 22203, in accordance with the regulations in 43 CPR 4.310-4.340. Your notice of appeal to the Board must be signed by you or your attorney and must be mailed within 30 days of the date of this decision. It should clearly identify the decision being appealed. If possible, attach a copy of this decision. You must send copies of your notice of appeal to (1) the Assistant Secretary - Indian Affairs, U.S. Department of the Interior, 1849 C Street, N.W., MS-4140-MIB, Washington, D.C. 20240, (2) each additional interested party known to you, and (3) this office. Your notice of appeal sent to the Interior Board of Indian Appeals must certify that you have sent copies to these parties. If you are not represented by an attorney, you may request assistance from this office in the preparation of your appeal. If you file a notice of appeal, the Board of Indian Appeals will notify you of further appeal procedures. If no appeal is timely filed, this decision will become final for the Department of the Interior at the expiration of the appeal period. No extension of time may be granted for filing a notice of appeal.
